I wish to express my sincere sympathy in the loss of your son, Second Lieutenant Glee M. Fox, 0705676, who met death on August 15, 1944, when the Liberator on which he was co-pilot crashed shortly after the take off on a heavy bombing mission to France.

Glee was given a military funeral and he was laid to rest in a beautiful American cemetery in Italy. The location of the grave will be made known to you when security regulations permit. There is little I can say that will alleviate the sorrow you are feeling at this time but may you find comfort in the knowledge that your son gave his life in the service of his country and for a cause in which he believed. His many friends, who also miss him, wish to join me in this heartfelt expression of sympathy.

Glee's personal belongings are being carefully packed and sent to the Effects Quartermaster at Kansas City, Missouri and from that point they will be forwarded to you.
