Award of the Distinguished Flying Cross .....II

### SECTION II -- AWARDS OF THE DISTINGUISHED FLYING CROSS

For extraordinary achievement while participating in aerial flight on a highly strategic bombardment mission against important enemy aircraft factories and installations in Austria on 23 April 1944. The personnel as shown, displayed exceptional leadership, courage and professional skill. The destruction of this target was of paramount importance to the war effort and through the concerted efforts of all concerned, the target was completely obliterated by one (1) of the most successful bombings experienced in the Mediterranean Theatre of Operations. Although under constant and aggressive attack by large numbers of determined enemy fighters, together with intense and heavy anti-aircraft fire, the formation fought through and accomplished the mission in an outstandingly superior manner. The personnel of the various lead aircraft displayed the highest form of leadership, coolness, cooperation and teamwork in holding the formation tightly together and effecting a perfect bombing run. Through this achievement, the large productive output of enemy aircraft in this vital manufacturing center was cut off at its source, thus effectively and seriously crippling enemy operational efficiency at time of great importance. This display of sound leadership, professional skill and extraordinary achievement reflects great credit upon the officers concerned and the Armed Forces of the United States of America.
